CAREFREE NATURAL HISTORY

I have not had any improvement at my bird feeders. Still have morning doves of three species and am seeing only one cardinal. I did have one surprise! I had seven bobwhites at the feeder one day. I have only seen them that one day, but at least it is encouraging to know they are still around. I still have not found, nor heard of anyone seeing the owl's nest. I think the nest is somewhere around the Clubhouse though, as they are calling from there. The ospreys are back along the 4th fairway. They are restructuring their nest so should be brooding not too far in the future.

I might mention some of the animals you may see in the park. Of course, gray squirrels are the most numerous. They are somewhat smaller than our Northern gray squirrels, once in a while we have had a fox squirrel. It has a "bandit" mask and is quite a bit larger than the gray squirrel. We have had two different ones around the 2nd and 3rd fairways and I had one pass through my backyard. Then we have the armadillo, which can be a pest if it gets under your unit. It also digs holes in the yard. Once in a while we have an opossum in the park. They are a light gray and, like a large rat with a long nose. As far as I know they do not get under unit but will dig small holes looking for beetles and grubs.

As always, call me if you have questions or see anything unusual. 'Til nex time!

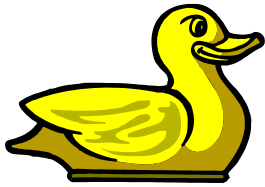
P.S. – Noon, January 26 – I just found the owl on the nest in the same spot they have been for the last 2 or 3 years!

As always, Activities promises you a memorable event with all profits being given to the association to defray the costs of our new dock. Join us for all fun!

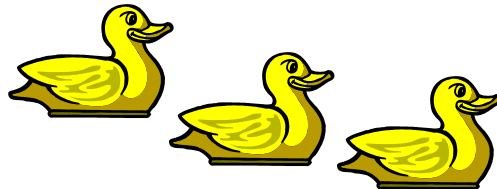

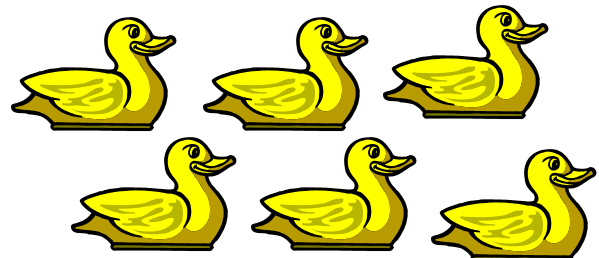
RUBBER RACE DUCKYS FOR SALE
